**MINUTES OF THE FOWLER CITY COUNCIL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 5, 2017**

Mayor Cardenas called the meeting to order at 7:01 p. m. Roll call was taken.

Councilmembers Present: Cardenas, Parra, Hammer, Kazarian, Rodriquez

City Staff Present: Interim City Manager/City Clerk Davis, Sergeant Miranda, City Attorney Wolfe, Fire Chief Lopez, City Attorney Cross

The Flag Salute and Pledge of Allegiance were led by Sergeant Joe Miranda, followed by an Invocation delivered by Pastor Bryan Mays.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Andy Gonzales, Fowler business owner, asked about permit fees for a neighboring business for placement of an advertising sign in the sidewalk planter. He asked about the proposed Taco Bell and when it would go before the Planning Commission. Staff confirmed that the Planning Commission will hold a special meeting on September 21, 2017 for the project.

APPROVE REQUEST TO CLOSE CITY STREETS FOR THE GURDWARA GUR NANAK PARKASH PARADE

Interim City Manager/City Clerk Davis said that a request to close City streets was received for the annual Gurdwara Gur Nanak Parkash parade, to be held Sunday, October 29, 2017. She noted that the parade is very well planned and managed, and traffic control will be provided. The applicant has coordinated with Public Works and Public Safety to prepare for the event.

Mayor Pro-Tem Parra made a motion to approve the request to close City streets for the Gurdwara Gur Nanak Parkash Parade on Sunday, October 29, 2017. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Rodriguez, and carried by unanimous voice vote: Ayes: Cardenas, Parra, Hammer, Kazarian, Rodriquez. Noes: None. Abstain/absent: None.

Interim City Manager Davis said that the presenter asked that the item be postponed.

STAFF REPORTS

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- ◆ **Discussion/direction for Voting Delegate(s) on Resolutions to be Considered at the League of California Cities Annual Conference**

Interim City Manager/City Clerk Davis stated that at the June 20, 2017 meeting, the Council approved Councilmember Kazarian as the Voting Delegate, and Mayor Pro-Tem Parra and Councilmember

Rodriguez as alternates, for the business meeting to be held at the upcoming League Annual Conference in Sacramento. The Council received a packet of information regarding the two resolutions that will be considered, both related to public safety. Police Chief Alcaraz and Fire Chief Lopez recommend support of the resolutions. After discussion, the consensus of the Council was that the voting delegate or alternates vote in support of the resolutions at the League Annual Conference.

Ms. Davis received information from Fresno COG that one of the projects that will be funded by SB1 transportation funds, is a \$99.9 million project for 32 miles of improvements on Highway 99 from Merced Street in Fowler to Rose Avenue in Selma. It is anticipated that the project will be underway very soon.

Ms. Davis said that according to a report received from the Fresno County Assessor's office, the City of Fowler's assessed property values increased by 11 percent over the previous tax year, which was the highest increase of all the cities within the County.

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR'S REPORT

No report was given.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Interim City Manager/City Clerk Davis distributed the HDL quarterly sales tax report.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Sargent Miranda reported that there has been an increase in property crimes, and the department is working on leads. The Department has started an official Facebook page to provide crime prevention information and tips.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Fire Chief Lopez reported that the Department has started performing standby duty at youth football and high school football games. He said that City Engineer Peters should have a cost estimate for the new fire station by the following week.

Councilmember Hammer spoke of the arrangements for the Tour-de-Fresno bike event that will begin and end in Fowler, on September 16, 2017. Trunk-or-Treat will be held on October 25, 2017.

Councilmember Kazarian stated that the design for the fire station is moving forward. Some minor modifications are being finalized and will soon be sent out to the Council. He reported that the Del Rey Community Service District will be added to the South Kings GSA. He attended a 5 Cities JPA meeting where a presentation was given by the Governor’s Go-Biz representative. He has suggested that the eastside cities form a cooperative in efforts to attract more retail businesses and restaurants to the area.

Councilmember Rodriquez announced several upcoming events at the Fowler Library.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

There were no public presentations.

PUBLIC HEARING: TO CONSIDER APPEAL OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S AUGUST 3, 2017, APPROVAL OF SITE PLAN REVIEW APPLICATION NO. 14-05 AND ASSOCIATED MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION - MAXCO SUPPLY, INC.

City Planning Consultant Dawn Marple gave background information on the Maxco Supply, Inc. box manufacturing project, to be located on the northeast corner of Golden State Boulevard and Manning Avenue. The 26 acre site is zoned M - 2 heavy industrial. The main building will be 280,000 square feet, and a future 12,000 square foot office building is planned. Maxco will operate various machinery for box making at the site and will use railway and trucks for transport and distribution. Maxco plans to employ 90 workers, and the future office facility will employ 30 more workers. An Initial Study (IS) and Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) was completed for the project. A letter was received from Golden State Environmental Social Justice Alliance voicing concerns with air quality, traffic, and noise from the project. Staff responded to the comments, and the applicant prepared a biological evaluation and applicable air quality, noise and other studies. The studies have resulted in no findings of significant environmental impacts from the project.

On August 3, 2017, the Planning Commission held a public hearing and adopted resolutions approving a site plan review and MND for the project, and made the required findings pursuant to the Fowler Municipal Code. After the hearing, on August 3, 2017, a representative of Social Justice Alliance filed an appeal of the Planning Commission actions.

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the Initial Study, Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, approve Site Plan Review No. 14-05 and Conditions of Approval, and make the findings that the IS and MND complies with the provisions of CEQA,

and that there is no new substantial evidence in the record that the project, with incorporation of mitigation measures and the Conditions of Approval, would have a significant adverse effect to the environment either directly or indirectly. Staff also recommends that the Council find that the project will not have an individual or cumulative adverse effect on the environment.

Mayor Cardenas opened the duly noticed public hearing on the matter at 6:17 p. m.

Dirk Poeschel, Planning Consultant for Maxco, spoke in favor of the project, noting that several others were present to support the project, including the Fresno County EDC and neighboring business, Carsey & Carsey. Representatives from the Dowling, Aaron law firm were present and have provided a letter of support, and a letter of support was also received from the Fowler Unified School District.

With no further comments, the public hearing was closed at 6:19 p.m.

AMENDMENT I TO AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDMENT I TO AGREEMENT, hereinafter referred to as Amendment I, is made this ____ day of _____, 2017, by and between the COUNTY OF FRESNO, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the CITY OF FOWLER, hereinafter referred to as the "City".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the County has been designated as the sponsoring agency to administer and implement the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program activities of the County, and its participating cities, in accordance with the provisions of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and the laws of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, on August 23, 2016, the County and the City entered into Agreement 16-537, hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement", whereby \$142,427 in CDBG funds were made available to the City for the Fowler ADA Improvements – Curb Ramps and Municipal Center Doors, Project No. 16231, hereinafter referred to as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, the City informed the County that the total estimated cost of the Project has increased from \$156,303 to \$185,769 due to increased construction costs; and

WHEREAS, the City has committed additional local funds to the Project in the amount of \$19,667, to cover a portion of the increased construction costs, raising the City's local financial contribution to \$33,353 from the original \$13,876; and

WHEREAS, the City now has an additional \$9,789 from its allocation of CDBG funds that may be made available to the Project to accommodate a portion of the increased construction costs under the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City has requested these additional CDBG funds in the amount of \$9,789 be made available to the Project for the purposes of this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual promises as hereinafter set forth, the City and the County agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- 1. That the text on Page 1, Lines 16 through 20 be amended to read:

"WHEREAS, the total cost of the Project is estimated to be \$185,769 and the City has

1 committed local funds to the Project in the amount of \$33,553 and is in need of \$152,216 in CDBG
2 funding to complete the Project; and

3 WHEREAS, the County can make available \$152,216 in CDBG funds needed for the
4 Project consisting of \$142,427 from the City's 2016-2017 CDBG allocation and additional CDBG
5 funding in the amount of \$9,789 that may be used by the City for this Project; and"

6 2. That the proposed Project budget on Page 2, Lines 18 through 20 be amended to

RESOLUTION NO. 2380

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER
SUPPORTING OUR DREAMERS AND THE DEFERRED ACTION FOR CHILDHOOD
ARRIVALS (DACA) PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, Since the California Dream Act of 2011 took effect in 2013, over 20,000 California students, referred to as “Dreamers,” have received state grant aid under this program, enabling them to afford a quality higher education and contribute further to our society; and

WHEREAS, The federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program, enacted by President Obama in 2012, has allowed over 230,000 undocumented residents of California who entered the country as minors to apply to receive legal work permits and live without fear of persecution or deportation; and

WHEREAS, In order to qualify for DACA status, an individual must have been brought to the United States before their 16th birthday, must not have been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, or three other misdemeanors, or otherwise be determined to pose a threat to national security, and must meet other requirements; and

WHEREAS, President Trump officially declared on September 5, 2017 that he will repeal the DACA program after a 6-month period, and officials of the federal government appear to have increased deportations of undocumented residents, including those who were led to believe they were protected due to their DACA status; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of DACA will result in a reduction in the American workforce and the reduction of nation’s economic growth for our nation at a cost of hundreds of billions of dollars over the first 10 years and a GDP loss of over \$11 billion a year in California alone; and

WHEREAS, The State of California and the City of Fowler are better served when all of our best and brightest students seek a higher education and pursue their careers, rather than remaining in the shadows;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Fowler urges President Donald Trump and the United States Senate and House of Representatives to act swiftly through legislative action to continue and codify President Obama’s Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program (DACA), which grants “Dreamers” — people who were brought into the country as children by their parents — a temporary reprieve from deportation.

RESOLVED, that the City of Fowler recognizes that nearly one-third of the nation’s nearly 800,000 Dreamers live in California where they have earned college degrees and found employment. California, including Fowler, needs college-educated young men and women to fuel our economy and cannot afford to lose our Dreamers to deportation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of Fowler transmit copies of this resolution to President Donald Trump, Congressman David Valadao and the entire California Congressional delegation, Senators Diana Feinstein and Kamala Harris and to our local State Legislators.
