### **RESOLUTION NO. 2483**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER DECLARING RESULTS OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020

WHEREAS, a municipal election for the purpose of electing three Councilmembers to fill terms expiring in November 2020, was duly consolidated with the Presidential General Election held on November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, said consolidated election was held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the polling places and voting booths were the same and the election officers the same as those provided for said general statewide election within the City of Fowler; and

WHEREAS, said election was held in all respects as if there were one election, and only one form of ballot was used; and

WHEREAS, the Fresno County Clerk/registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of the election in the form and manner required by law and has certified the results and provided the Statement of Votes Cast at the Election in the City of Fowler and Certificate of County Clerk to Results of the Canvass ("Statement") to the Fowler City Clerk as the City's election official in accordance with Elections Code Section 10262(b) and the Fowler City Council, and said results are received and attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Fowler City Clerk has certified the results of the election as reflected in the certification included as part of Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Fowler met at the Council Chambers thereof in the City Hall in the City of Fowler on Tuesday, December 8, 2020, at the hour of 7:00 o'clock p.m. of said day to examine the returns of said election and declare the results of said election and install the newly elected officers at said election; and the returns of said election having been canvassed by the Fresno County Clerk who was retained by said City Council to conduct said general municipal election pursuant to the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California, and said Fresno County Clerk having canvassed said returns in the form and manner required by law and having submitted to the City Council his certificate as to the results of the canvass of said general municipal election, the Council find the whole number of votes cast, the names of the persons voted for, and all other matters required by law to be as hereinafter stated:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fowler as follows:

- 1. The general municipal election was consolidated with a general statewide election held and conducted in the City of Fowler on Tuesday, the 3<sup>rd</sup> of November 2020, in the time, form and manner required by law.
  - 2. There was a total of two (2) voting precincts, with the polling places, voting booths

and election officers the same as provided for said general statewide election in the City of Fowler.

- 3. The total ballots cast in said general municipal election were 2,879; that the said ballots were cast by vote by mail ballot or at a voting precinct, for the persons, and the measure, in total numbers as set forth on the certificate of said Fresno County Clerk, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 4. At said general municipal election, Karnig Ronald Kazarian, Juan Mejia, and Daniel Parra were elected Councilmembers of the City of Fowler for the full term of four (4) years.
- 5. In accordance with Elections Code section 10264, The City Clerk shall enter on the Records of the City of Fowler the Statement of the results of the election attached hereto as Exhibit A, showing the following;
  - 1. The whole number of votes cast in said City of Fowler for Councilmember:
  - 2. The names of the persons voted for;
  - 3. The office of which each person was voted for;
  - 4. The number of votes given as each precinct to each person:
  - 5. The number of votes given in the City of each person.
- 6. A "CERTIFICATE OF ELECTION" shall be executed and delivered to the Councilmembers elected at said election. The City Clerk shall administer to said Councilmembers so elected the oath of office prescribed in the State Constitution, and have him subscribe thereto, whereupon they shall be inducted into the office to which they have been elected.
- 7. The City Clerk shall certify the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the official record of the City.

### REQUESTED ACTION / RECOMMENDATION

Award the Main Street Improvements project to Don Berry Construction in the amount of \$165,887.40.

### **DISCUSSION**

On November 24, 2020, the City received 6 responsive bids for the City's Main Street Improvements project. The project proposes to mill and overlay, install pavement striping, and install ADA ramps along Main Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and 7<sup>th</sup> Street. The bids received for the Base Bid ranged from \$165,887.40 to \$218,582.00. The Engineer's Estimate for this project was \$223,616.00.

Attached is the summary of the 6 responsive bids received.

### PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Kathleen Mclemore, Fowler resident, voiced her concerns regarding people not picking up after their pets. She is requesting signs be placed in and around her neighborhood.

### PRESENTATION OF EMPLOYEE PLAQUES FOR YEARS OF SERVICE

Mayor Cardenas presented plaques to employees for their years of service with the City. Plaques were presented to Building Official Nolasco Baxa, 5 years; Deputy City Clerk Corina Burrola, 10 years; Fire Chief Manuel Lopez, 15 years; and City Manager Jeannie Davis, 25 years.

### COMMUNICATIONS

City Manager Davis said the City will be having a small grand opening ceremony for the new fire station on Thursday, December 10, 2020. COVID precautions will be in place.

She said the City is preparing for the Christmas Tree Lighting event for December 5, 2020.

### STAFF REPORTS

### Second Reading of Ordinance No. 2020-06

City Planner Marple joined via teleconference. Ms. Marple said on October 20, 2020, the Fowler City Council re-introduced Ordinance 2020-06, with changes to the version originally introduced on October 6, 2020. The Ordinance makes minor amendments to various development standards applicable to accessory buildings in residential zone districts in the City, and also adds additional uses and makes minor amendments to various permitted and conditional uses in the neighborhood commercial, general commercial, light industrial, and form-based code area zone districts in the City.

Councilmember Kazarian made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 2020-06, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Hammer. The motion carried by roll call vote: Ayes: Kazarian, Hammer, Cardenas, and Parra. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Rodriquez.

### **CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT**

### Consider Adoption of Resolution No. 2480 - All-Way Stop - 8th Street / Fresno Street

City Engineer Peters said the intersection of 8<sup>th</sup> Street and Fresno Street is currently a three-legged intersection with a stop sign on the minor approach. The other approach on 8<sup>th</sup> Street is not stop controlled. The speed limit on 8<sup>th</sup> Street is 35-mph and the speed limit on Fresno Street is 25 mph. Due to recent changes at the intersection he and Public Works Director Dominquez prepared a warrant study at the intersection in accordance with the California Manuel on Uniform Traffic Control Devices to determine whether the intersection met the criteria for an all-way stop control. The study was completed and found that due to site distance deficiencies at the intersection mainly parked cars and the outdoor dining structure impair the sight distance for Fresno Street traffic. He is recommending that Council adopt Resolution No. 2480 converting the intersection of 8<sup>th</sup> Street and Fresno Street to an all-way stop.

The Council asked if the owner of Jocy's Restaurant, Mr. Arteaga, was contacted regarding the issue. Public Works Director Dominguez said he did speak with Mr. Arteaga and he did have some concerns. A discussion took place concerning placing an all-way stop and the affects it will have on some of the surrounding businesses and the semi-truck trailers delivering cargo to the nearby packing businesses. Councilmember Kazarian asked if a temporary stop sign could be placed on a temporary basis verses permanently. Mr. Peters said the intersection is already converted to a temporary all-way stop control. His recommendation is to approve the all-way stop tonight, and if the outdoor structure is removed, sometime in the future, it then can be re-evaluated.

Councilmember Parra made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2480, "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Fowler Designating the 5<sup>th</sup> Street / Fresno Street Intersection as All-Way Stop; seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Hammer. The motion carried by roll call vote: Ayes: Parra, Hammer, Cardenas, and Kazarian. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Rodriquez.

### Discussion/Direction Regarding Circulation Strategies at the State Route 99 / Adams Avenue Interchange

City Engineer Peters said there has been an increase in recent development activity in the vicinity of the Adams Avenue / State Route 99 interchange. Staff has determined that a new road connection near the existing southbound off-ramp is needed to support additional development and to provide circulation within the areas of Fowler bounded by Sumner Avenue, Clovis Avenue, Adams Avenue, and State Route 99. Staff met with Caltrans and explored very preliminary alternatives for circulation improvements at this interchange. He said Caltrans is in support of the circulation. He said one alternative is to construct a roundabout at the southbound off-ramp intersection with Adams Avenue the other alternative was identified in a SW area traffic impact study approved by the Council in 2015. Mr. Peters provided the interchange alternatives exhibits for viewing. He said the next step in developing alternatives would be to prepare an interchange and freeway corridor study on State Route 99 between Clovis Avenue and Merced Street as directed by Caltrans. A discussion took place and the direction of the Council is to have staff gather more information and bring it back to Council for further review and discussion.

### CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

### **COVID-19 Update**

City Manager Davis said the City is currently at 320 total cases, 192 closed cases, 3 deaths, and 7 are under investigation. She said the County Health Department provided information that COVID cases are raising. The County provided information on COVID guidelines on travel advisory for non-essential travel and Thanksgiving celebration, the information is posted on the City's website.

She said the Million Mask Giveaway, sponsored by Fresno County EDC and County of Fresno Supervisors, provided cases of masks and hand sanitizers for small businesses across the County.

Ms. Davis said the City is currently working with United Health Center on setting up COVID testing events.

Approve Resolution No. 2481 – Extending the Temporary Outdoor Business Operations Assistance Program for Restaurants, Retail Businesses, and Service Businesses in the City

City Manager Davis said in August 2020 Council approved Resolution No. 2475 approving Temporary Outdoor Business Operations Assistance Program funding \$10,000 of 2020 Coronavirus Relief Funds, which funding was available to eligible businesses in the City for a limited period of time. The program funding was not fully utilized and the eligibility period expired in September 2020. She said the City would like to extend the eligibility period through March 1, 2021 to provide enough time for businesses to make purchases for heaters and other items in order to stay in business.

The City would then reduce the funding from \$10,000 to \$5,000 and transfer \$5,000 into a Covid-19 Business Assistance Grant program if approved by the Council. The grant program would provide direct grant for \$1,000 to assist certain businesses that have had to shut down their operations, or reduce indoor customer seating for full service restaurants.

She said the City extended funds to make certain outdoor seating and related improvements along Merced Street which where utilized by four businesses, those four businesses would be excluded from the reimbursement program but they would be eligible for the grant program. Councilmember Kazarian said Fowler Donuts did not benefit from the outdoor seating along Merced Street and asked that they be removed from the list of the four businesses ineligible under the reimbursement program.

Councilmember Kazarian made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2481, as amended, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Hammer. The motion carried by roll call vote: Ayes: Kazarian, Hammer, Cardenas, and Parra. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Rodriquez

Councilmember Kazarian made a motion to approve proposed COVID-19 Business Assistant Grant Program, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Hammer. The motion carried by roll call vote: Ayes: Kazarian, Hammer, Cardenas, and Parra. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Rodriquez.

### PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Public Works Director Dominguez said he submitted an application for a Public Safety Power Shut-Off Grant (PSPS) in the amount of \$271,000 to purchase backup generators. Funding is available to support equipment purchases and to improve local preparedness and response for PSPS events.

He said a pre-construction meeting was held on Tuesday, November 10, 2020 for the Panzak Park Improvements Project. Construction will be starting next Monday, November 23<sup>rd</sup>.

### FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

No report was given.

### POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Police Chief Alcaraz circulated the DOJ crime statistics for the month of October 2020.

Chief Alcaraz commended his officers for apprehending a suspect involved in a robbery from another city.

### FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Fire Chief Lopez said they are nearly finished moving into the new fire station. He thanked everyone involved in the process of the new fire station.

Mayor Cardenas asked Fire Chief Lopez if they will be placing a flag pole in front of the new fire station. He said he attended a Fowler Lions Club meeting and they are looking to donate funds for community service projects. Councilman Kazarian, who is currently the Finance Committee Chairman for the Lions Club, said he will submit the idea to the Lions Club for a flag pole.

### CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

City Attorney Cross said a new law signed by Governor Newsom, Assembly Bill (AB) 992, which amends the Brown Act's prohibition of serial meetings, to permit certain social media communications. Under the revised law, board members may communicate with their communities via social media, but may not communicate directly with other members of their board on any issue of board business. Even simply "liking" another board member's post has the potential to create a violation of the Brown Act.

### **CONSENT CALENDAR**

The consent calendar consisted of: A) Ratification of Warrants – November 17, 2020; B) Approve Minutes of the City Council Meeting – October 20, 2020; C) Approve Resolution No. 2482, A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Fowler Approving a Residential Water Service Discontinuation Policy";

Councilmember Kazarian said he introduced a proposal he presented to the Five Cities Joint Power Authority to come together for a branding effort to identify the City as a District.

### REQUESTED ACTION / RECOMMENDATION

Adopt Resolution 2484 committing to the timely use of federal and state funding.

### **DISCUSSION**

On March 25, 2020, the Fresno Council of Governments (FCOG) Policy Board officially initiated the Cycle 5 Active Transportation Program (ATP) Call for Projects. The ATP is a competitive statewide program created to encourage increased use of active modes of transportation, such as biking and walking. The funding/programming years include the 21/22, 22/23, 23/24 and 24/25 fiscal years.

Staff has identified the following proposed project that is eligible to receive ATP funding and will be submitted for funding consideration.

1. Fremont Elementary/ Marshall Elementary/ Fowler High Safe Routes to School

This project was identified based on needs that have been observed by the community over the past several years. The estimate for the identified project is \$426,000 and is expected to be 100% reimbursable.

The grant application packages for the regional bid funds were submitted on September 15, 2020.

To comply with the requirements of the application package for the current cycle of the ATP federal transportation funding programs, the City must adopt a resolution committing to the timely use of the federal funding or risk the loss of such funds. A resolution stating this commitment is attached.

Staff recommends adopting the resolution committing to the timely use of the federal funding and requests that the Council provide concurrence with the proposed projects to be submitted in the grant applications and/or provide further direction as appropriate.

### **RESOLUTION 2484**

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER IN THE MATTER OF FEDERAL TRANSPORTATION PROJECT SELECTION AND IMPLEMENTING TIMELY USE OF FUNDING

WHERAS, AB 1012 has been enacted into State Law in part to provide for the "timely use" of State and Federal funding; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fowler is able to apply for and receive Federal and State funding under the Active Transportation Program;

WHEREAS, the City of Fowler desires to ensure that its projects are delivered in a timely manner to preclude the Fresno Region from losing those funds for non-delivery; and

WHEREAS, it is understood by the City of Fowler that failure for not meeting project delivery dates for any phase of a project may jeopardize federal or state funding to the Region; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fowler must demonstrate dedicated and available local matching funds; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Fowler hereby agrees to ensure that all project delivery deadlines for all project phases will be met or exceeded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that failure to meet project delivery deadlines may be deemed as sufficient cause for the Fresno Council of Governments Policy Board to terminate an agency's project and reprogram Federal/State funds as deemed necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Fowler does direct its management and engineering staffs to ensure all projects are carried out in a timely manner as per the requirements of AB 1012 and the directive of the City Council of the City of Fowler
