Proclamation

WHEREAS, the City of Fowler mourns with the sons, daughters, grandchildren, and greatgrandchildren of the over 1.5 million innocent Armenians who perished from 1915 to 1923 in the mass and systematic extermination perpetrated by the Ottoman Empire; and

WHEREAS, after decades of capitulating to geopolitical pressures, a president of the United States, Joe Biden, unequivocally declared those atrocities as genocide, representing a historic step toward fully realizing our nation's commitment to human rights across the world and addressing generational victimization at home; and

WHEREAS, a dangerous precedent has been set in light of ongoing Turkish denial without any consequences, and we can no longer let the Armenian Genocide serve as a blueprint for further genocides; and

WHEREAS, evidence is mounting in Ukraine to support genocidal claims, and the City of Fowler supports the international community's unified response, which includes sanctions, to Russian aggression; and

WHEREAS, this global condemnation resulting in actionable steps such as sanctions would be strengthened as a deterrent by considering similar measures for the continued denial by the Turkish government of such a horrendous and well-documented act of genocide; and

WHEREAS, in remembering the Armenian Genocide, the City of Fowler also seeks to bring awareness to preventing future genocides.

NOW, THEREFORE, we, Councilmembers of the City of Fowler, do hereby proclaim that this City recognizes April 24, 2022, as:

DAY OF REMEMBRANCE OF THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE AND PREVENTION OF FUTURE GENOCIDES

RECOMMENDATION

Approve Resolution No. 2554 if the City Council makes the findings required by Government Code Section 54953(e)(3) to continue to allow City Council members to attend City Council meetings via remote teleconferencing without following typical Brown Act requirements for teleconference participation by City Council members at City Council meetings. The Resolution also authorizes the City's other commissions to continue meeting remotely for as long as the City Council authorizes.

BACKGROUND

The City Council approved Resolution No. 2522 on October 19, 2021, authorizing remote teleconferencing for City Council and City commission meetings in accordance with Government Code Section 54953 as amended by AB 361 during the COVID-19 declared emergency. To continue with the "relaxed" remote teleconferencing for City Council and other commission meetings Government Code Section 54953 requires the City Council to make findings every 30 days that (1) it has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency, and either (a) the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person, or (b) state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

Fowler City Council meetings are currently conducted in a manner that allows the public and Council members to attend in person or via teleconference in compliance with applicable legal requirements. Approving this resolution would not change the way members of the public are allowed to participate in meetings (both in-person and teleconference attendance is allowed) and would also allow City Council members to continue to attend meetings via teleconference, if desired, without complying with the typical Brown Act requirements for teleconferencing attendance at City Council meetings.

The proclaimed COVID-19 emergency is still in effect and there may be occasions when the proclaimed emergency directly impacts the ability of members of the public or Council members to meet safely in person. Also, some state and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing. As a result, the necessary findings can be made, if desired, to continue with remote teleconferencing for City Council and other commission meetings. These findings must be made every 30 days to continue with the relaxed Brown Act teleconference requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This action does not constitute a "project" pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

FISCAL IMPACT

No fiscal impact is anticipated whether this Resolution is approved or not.

- **WHEREAS**, on March 4, 2020, the Governor of California declared a state of emergency in the State as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; and
- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Resolution 2461, approved by the Fowler City Council on March 17, 2020, the City Council declared a local emergency as a result of the threatened spread of COVID-19 in the City, surrounding areas, and the state; and
- **WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2020, with the issuance of Executive Order N-29-20, the Governor suspended certain provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act in order to allow local legislative bodies to conduct meetings telephonically or by other remote means; and
- **WHEREAS**, on June 11, 2021, the Governor issued Executive Order N-08-21, which placed an end date of September 30, 2021, for agencies to meet remotely; and
- WHEREAS, AB 361 was enacted on September 16, 2021, enacting certain changes to the Brown Act for teleconferencing and remote participation at public meetings as set forth in Government Code Section 54953; and
- WHEREAS, the state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor on March 4, 2020, has not been rescinded and remains in effect; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that teleconferencing from remote locations by the public and City Council members has not limited participation of members of the public, Council members, or other attendees at City Council or other City commission meetings; and
- **WHEREAS**, on October 19, 2021, the City Council approved Resolution No. 2522 authorizing remote teleconferencing for City Council and City commission meetings in accordance with Government Code Section 54953 as amended by AB 361; and
- **WHEREAS,** Government Code Section 54953, as amended by AB 361, requires the City Council to make certain findings every 30 days after approving Resolution No. 2522 in order to continue with remote teleconferencing.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Fowler as follows:
- 1. The City Council has reconsidered the circumstances of the COVID-19 state of emergency and finds that the following circumstances exist:

- A. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members of the public, City Council members, and members of other City commissions to meet safely in person; and
- B. State or local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing.
- 2. This Resolution shall be effective immediately and a similar resolution shall be a standing item on City Council meeting agendas each month to reconsider the circumstances of the COVID-19 state of emergency and determine whether the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of members of the public, City Council members, and members of other City commissions to meet safely in person, or whether state or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing, until the necessary findings required for continuing remote teleconferencing are no longer approved by the City Council.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend the City Council approve a resolution declaring the property located at 119 South 6th Street (APN 343-172-09T) to be surplus pursuant to the Surplus Land Act.

BACKGROUND

The City of Fowler is subject to the State of California's Surplus Land Act which places requirements on the City prior to disposing real property. Some of these include:

- The City must take formal action in a regular public meeting declaring land surplus.
- The City may not negotiate with interested entities from including deal terms that would reduce or disallow residential use of the site.
- The City must send a notice of availability to specified agencies and housing sponsors that have notified the Department of Housing and Community Development of their interest and allow sixty days for a response.
- The City must, prior to agreeing to the terms for the disposition of surplus land, provide specified information about the disposition process to the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). HCD then has thirty days to review the information and submit written findings.

Declaring the above referenced property surplus will allow the City to fulfill the requirements of the Surplus Land Act and move forward with disposition. The parcel is in the Form Based Code zone area, its proposed General Plan planned land use is Community Commercial, and the parcel is approximately a quarter acre. Staff have not yet obtained an appraisal or comparable values for the area.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This does not constitute a "project" pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

FISCAL IMPACT

The sale of the property could generate one-time proceeds.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Staff is not aware of any conflicts of interest.

RESOLUTION NO. 2555

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER, CALIFORNIA, DECLARING THE PROPERTY AT 119 SOUTH 6TH STREET (APN 343-172-09T) TO BE SURPLUS AND DIRECTING CITY STAFF TO COMPLY WITH THE SURPLUS LAND ACT

WHEREAS, under the Surplus Land Act, Government Code Section 54220-54234, surplus land is defined as "land owned in fee simple by any local agency for which the local agency's governing body takes formal action in a regular public meeting declaring that the land is surplus and is not necessary for the agency's use."; and

WHEREAS, land shall be declared either "surplus land" or "exempt surplus land, "as supported by written findings, before a local agency may take any action to dispose of it consistent with an agency's policies or procedures; and

WHEREAS, "agency's use" shall include, but not be limited to, land that is being used, or is planned to be used pursuant to a written plan adopted by the local agency's governing board, for work or operations, including, but not limited to, utility sites, watershed property, land being used for conservation purposes, land for demonstration, exhibition, or educational purposes related to greenhouse gas emissions, and buffer sites near sensitive governmental uses, including, but not limited to, waste water treatment plants, but shall not include commercial or industrial uses or activities, including nongovernmental retail, entertainment, or office development or property disposed of for the sole purpose of investment or generation of revenue; and

WHEREAS, City staff has identified 119 South 6th Street (APN 343-172-09T) as potential surplus real property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 54222, City staff will send a written offer to sell the surplus property to the entities and agencies identified in Government Code Section 54222 et seq. If one of the entities/agencies desires to purchase the property after having received notice, it must indicate its intent to do so in writing within 60 days of receiving the notice, and the City and the other entity/agency may negotiate price and terms for the disposition of the property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 54230.5, City staff will provide to the Department of Housing and Community Development a description of the notices of availability sent, and negotiations conducted with any responding entities, in regard to the disposal of each parcel of surplus land; and

WHEREAS, in the event no agreement is reached between the City and any interested entity/agency to whom notice is provided, City staff will present Council with proposals for disposition of the surplus property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Fowler that:

- 1. The City Council hereby declares 119 South 6th Street (APN 343-172-09T) and any rights, title and interest herein, surplus.
- 2. City staff is hereby directed to send all notices and take all actions required by the Surplus Property Land Act.

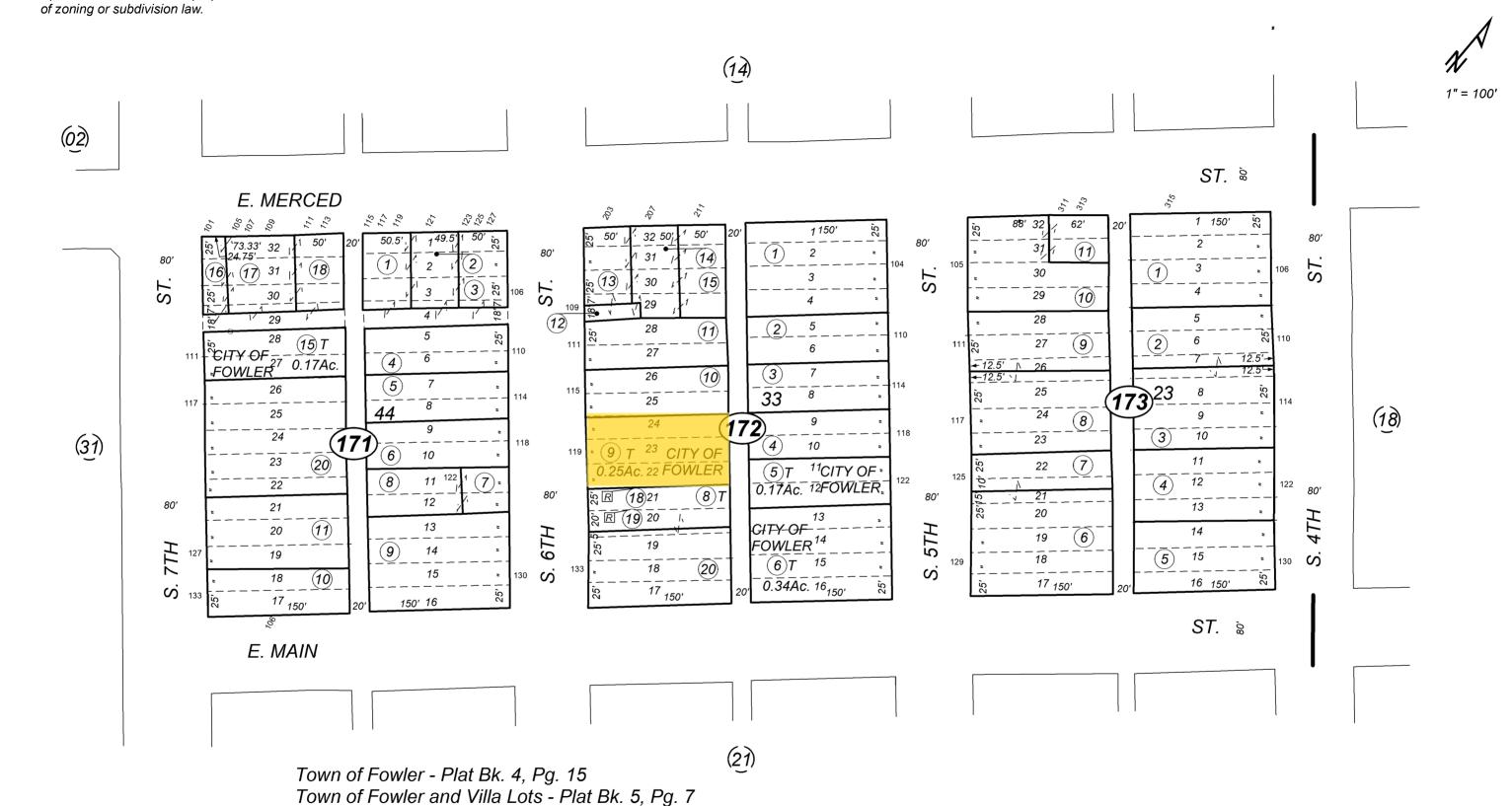

SUBJECT

Actions pertaining to the fiscal year 2021-22 third quarter financial report and budget amendments:

- ACCEPT the fiscal year 2021-22 third guarter budget report.
- ADOPT Resolution No. 2556 approving fiscal year 2021-22 proposed budget amendments.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend City Council accept the fiscal year 2021-22 third quarter financial report and adopt Resolution No. 2556 approving fiscal year 2021-22 budget amendments.

BACKGROUND

The quarterly report summarizes the City's revenue and expenditure activity for the third quarter of the fiscal year from July 1, 2021 through March 31, 2022. The third quarter budget reports provide the data to inform any necessary budget amendments to ensure that the budget is balanced at the end of the fiscal year. As such, staff recommend budget amendments based on one-time revenues and expenses in the third quarter of the fiscal year. Below is a summary of revenues received and expenditures made for each fund type through March 31, 2022.

GENERAL FUND

The General Fund covers core services such as police, fire, public works, community development, parks, recreation, and the senior center. Sales and property taxes are the two largest sources of revenue in the General Fund. Revenues in the General Fund are at 64% and expenditures are at 70% for the third quarter, as follows:

REVENUES

As summarized in Attachment A, March 31, 2022 is 75% of the fiscal year 2022. The General Fund revenues received were at 64% of the annual budget estimates. Key revenues receipts appear to be on target with the revenue estimates.

PROPERTY TAX

Revenues are at 59% of budget

A major portion of property tax revenue was distributed to the City in December. The city received \$550,147, 59% of the estimate. The next major distribution will occur in June.

PERMITS/LICENSES

Revenues are at 141% of budget

The City received 141% of permits/licenses fees through March 31, 2022. Charges for services are higher through March 31, 2022. Building permits are at \$617,333 and plan check fees at \$240,968 which make up a large portion of these estimated revenues. Increased permits and development activity are responsible for the increase. Several budget amendments are proposed to account for the projected growth in development activity.

FINES & FEES

Revenues are at 56% of budget

Fines and Fees are at 56% through March 31, 2022.

USE OF MONEY & PROPERTY RENTAL INCOME

Revenues are at 52% of budget

Revenues from rental and interest income are on target. The majority of rental income are received from Unwired broadband for the water tower.

MOTOR VEHICLE IN LIEU

Revenues are at 52% of budget

The motor vehicle in lieu revenues are property tax shares allocated to cities and counties by the State. Revenues received through the third quarter is at \$421,332, 52% of estimate.

SALES TAX

Revenues are at 61% of budget

The Sales tax revenues represent the largest funding source in the General Fund. At 61% actual revenues collected in the third quarter, revenues are on target through the third quarter.

TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX

Revenues are at 50% of budget

Transient occupancy taxes are received on a quarterly basis, reflecting \$74,304 of estimate through the third quarter.

FRANCHISE FEES

Revenues are at 68% of budget

Franchise fees are received in a quarterly basis, total received through third quarter is \$262,785, 68% of estimate budget.

SERVICES & OTHER FEES

Revenues are at 58% of budget

Revenues from services & other fees are currently at 58% and are anticipated to meet budgeted expectations. These revenues are from various sources such as recreation, inspection, planning, park maintenance, and special police services.

GRANT

Revenues are at 11% of budget

Grant funding received through third quarter is at \$23,354. Staff anticipate grants to be on target at end of year.

OTHER MISC REVENUE

Revenues are at 254% of budget

Revenues from other sources at are currently at 254%. These miscellaneous revenues include donations, P.O.S.T reimbursements, restitution, and other refunds. It is typical for revenues in this category to reflect higher percentages than budgeted. A proposed budget amendment is requested for one-time revenues received for sale of real property.

TRANSFER IN

Revenues are at 0% of budget

A general ledger entry will be done to allocate the transfer in and transfer out to the appropriate funds at year end.

EXPENDITURES

As summarized in Attachment A, the city has expended roughly 70% of its appropriations as of March 31, 2022. All departments are on target to their budgeted lines from actual to budget through the third quarter.

As summarized in Attachment B, the summary of all funds revenues reflects the revenues and expenditures through the third quarter by fund type as summarized below:

ENTERPRISE FUNDS

WATER UTILITY

Revenues 75% | Expenses 61%

Through March 31, 2022, expenses are at 61% of budget and revenues slightly higher at 75% of budget. A budget amendment is proposed to adjust revenues to actual for the Water Arrearage Grant of \$141,948.

SPECIAL REVENUES FUNDS

UTILITY USERS TAX

Revenues 81% | Expenses 20%

Utility User's Tax are paid to the city one month in arrears. At third quarter revenues received are at \$325,815, or 81% of budget, and expenses at 12%. An end of year transfer entry will be done to reconcile all transfers from UUT.

DISTRICT SALES TAX (MEASURE N)

Revenues 111% | Expenses 6%

District Sales Tax Funds are received on a monthly basis. Revenues are \$1,105,515 through the third quarter. Expenses are currently at 6% of budget. A budget amendment is proposed to adjust revenues to account for projected growth in district sales tax.

COPS GRANT

Revenues 97% | Expenses 15%

COPS grant reimbursement are processed once expenses are made. The expenses will be adjusted at year end.

RECYCLE GRANT

Revenues 0% | Expenses 60%

Recycle Grant is at 0% through the third quarter. Expenses are at 60%, staff anticipates to be on target at end of year.

GAS TAX

Revenues 59% | Expenses 93%

Highway User Tax (gas tax) revenues are received monthly. The 93% reflects principal & interest payments made through the third quarter for debt service on the Merced Street Rehab.

STREETS PROJECTS

Revenues 100% | Expenses 111%

Street Projects reimbursement are processed once expenses are made reflecting revenues at 100% and expenses at 111%. A budget amendment is proposed to adjust to actual expenses for Adams construction.

ARPA

Revenues 100% | Expenses 16%

The budgeted first tranche of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds has been received at 100% in revenues. Expenses budgeted at 16% for these funds include employee premium pay, Council Chambers AV modernization, and water meter upgrades.

LTF ART 3 & 8

Revenues 0% | Expenses 28%

LTF revenues are generated from Fresno County. Expenses include utilities, PG&E, and street sweeping.

MEASURE C

Revenues 110% | Expenses 1%

\$263,423 in monthly Measure C revenues have been received thus far. Budgeted expenses include ADA repairs and Paving projects to be completed by end of year.

SB1 RMRA

Revenues 82% | Expenses 0%

SB1 revenues are received monthly from the State. Budgeted expenses include street paving projects to be completed by end of year.

CDBG

Revenues 101% | Expenses 0%

Community Development Block Grant reflects 101% of revenues received through the third quarter reflecting a one-time loan payoff and 0% in expense.

AB1600 IMPACT FEES

Due to high volume of development activity in the city and the newly-adopted impact fees, the various AB1600 revenues are reflecting a range from 108% to 180% through the third quarter.

DEBT SERVICE FUNDS

The long-term debt report for the 1993-1 funds, Fire Station, and the Financing Authority are all showing expenses up to 94% through the third quarter. This is due to a significant debt service payment being made in September. These payments are made semiannually. Additionally, principal payments are paid in the fall and not in the spring. Revenues and expenses are projected to meet the budgeted amount at year end.

SUCCESSOR AGENCY

The RDA is responsible for the 2010 refunding bonds debt service. Two payments are made annually. Expenses are currently at 65% of budget.

BUDGET AMENDMENTS

As summarized in Attachment C, staff propose several third quarter budget amendments to align the expenditures and revenues to the budget. The following budget amendments are proposed:

GENERAL FUND

Revenues

Adjustments are needed to bring revenues and expenses to actual. Adjustments to Building Permits, Plan Check Fees, Franchise Fees, Gen Plan Update, Grant Revenue, Miscellaneous Revenues, and Other Reimbursements are needed to accommodate increased revenues.

Expenses

The fiscal year 2021-22 budget reflects the process of staff developing a city budget using unaudited data, operating fiscal year 2020-21 via continuing resolution, and the lack of sufficient information to have a true "base budget." Adjustments are needed to various categories across departments professional services, legal services, fuel, one-time expenses related to computer support, and a change in utilities cost distribution.

SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

District Sales Tax

Adjust to actual unbudgeted district sales tax growth.

Debt Service 88-1

Adjust to actual unbudgeted revenues for current year secure taxes.

Assessment District 93-1

Adjust to actual unbudgeted revenues for current year secure taxes.

Assessment District 94-1

Adjust to actual unbudgeted revenues for prepaid property assessment.

Utility Users Tax

Adjust to actual unbudgeted onetime expenses for professional services.

AB1600 Impact Fees Funds

Several adjustments to revenue funds are needed due to increased development activity.

Street Projects

An adjustment is needed to record the ongoing expenses to Adams Phase 2 & 3 construction, the expense must be made in order to receive reimbursement.

ENTERPRISE FUNDS

Water Fund

An adjustment to budgeted revenues is needed due a one-time water grant for the Water Arrearage Grant.

TCP Fund

An adjustment is needed to increase revenues for funding received for the TCP settlement.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This action does not constitute a "project" pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

FISCAL IMPACT

Revenues and expenditures for all fund types are on target for the third quarter.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Staff is not aware of any conflicts of interest.

REPORT TO THE CITY COUNCIL

April 19, 2022

FROM DARIO DOMINGUEZ, Public Works Director

SUBJECT

Discuss and Consider Actions pertaining to the City of Fowler's Solar/Energy Conservation Project:

- A. Receive analysis from ARC Alternatives regarding alternatives for Project procurement process.
- B. Provide Staff direction on next steps for the Project, which may include authorizing the City Manager or designee to negotiate a Project Agreement with the selected vendor.
- C. ADOPT Resolution No. 2557 approving California Energy Commission Energy Conservation Assistant Act (ECAA) loan application submittal and related CEQA exemption.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommend City Council provide direction on this item.

BACKGROUND

On October 5, 2020, the City released a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the Energy Conservation and Energy Generation Project and received one response from Sitelogiq Inc. Sitelogiq proposed two solar array sites at the cost of \$1,339,595.00. Staff began negotiations with Sitelogiq and in the course of negotiations, Staff felt it was in the best interest of the City to solicit additional proposals and include additional potential sites. As part of this due diligence, Staff contacted four additional solar companies and received two additional proposals for three total solar array sites within the City. Staff provided SitelogIQ with the opportunity to revisit its proposal and provide an updated proposal including the opportunity to include the third solar array site proposed in the other two proposals.

On July 20, 2021, Staff presented the three proposals to City Council. Each solar provider was available to answer City Council questions about their proposals and qualifications. During that meeting, City

Council directed Staff to meet with each solar provider to obtain additional information, obtain a breakdown of their cost estimates and return to Council.

Staff requested the additional information from each of the solar providers and provided a week to respond. Subsequently, one of the solar providers withdrew from the process. On August 3, 2021, Staff presented a side-by-side comparison of the remaining two proposals. After much discussion, City Council directed Staff to work with a third-party solar consultant to review the proposals and bring one recommendation back to City Council.

Per the City of Fowler Informal Competitive Purchasing Policy, Staff solicited three bids for the third-party analysis. ARC Alternatives was selected to perform the third-party analysis based upon their experience, cost, and ability to complete the work in a timely matter. On December 7, 2021, ARC Alternatives virtually attended a City Council meeting to present findings and answer questions. Mr. Russell Driver, Principal and Co-Founder of ARC Alternatives, and Simon Olivieri, Senior Engineer with ARC Alternatives presented the findings, recommendations and answered questions. One such recommendation was the City should only pursue solar on the Fire Station site. During that meeting, City Council directed Staff to continue to work with ARC Alternatives to pursue additional vendor bids and work with SitelogIQ on a possible cost reduction.

ARC Alternatives worked with Staff to develop a procurement process to solicit pricing for the Fire Station solar project. The Request for Proposals was released on January 31, 2022, and closed on March 4, 2022. ARC Alternatives will be virtually attending the City Council meeting to present the findings, recommendations, and answer any questions City Council may have. Staff will seek direction from City Council on next steps, which may include contract negotiations with the recommended firm.

Concurrently with the procurement process, ARC Alternatives has been working with Staff to submit the California Energy Commission ECAA loan application. Should City Council direct staff to begin negotiations with a selected vendor, the vendor's scope will include completion of the interconnection application with Pacific Gas & Electric to ensure the City's project is grandfathered under Net Energy Metering (NEM) 2.0. City Council direction on a preferred vendor and their respective pricing will also be needed to finalize the ECAA loan application.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Solar/energy conservation improvements at existing facilities is categorically exempt pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15301.

FISCAL IMPACT

None at this time. Should City Council direct Staff to begin negotiations with a selected vendor and approve the submittal of the ECAA loan application, the pricing from that vendor would be included in the ECAA loan application and a contract with the selected vendor and applicable loan documents for the ECAA loan would be brought to City Council for approval at a subsequent meeting.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF ENERGY EFFICIANCY LOAN APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA ENERGY COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the City of Fowler endorses the goal of energy efficiency and development of energy efficient and renewable energy generation projects for use at existing City facilities and sites; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has received and reviewed information and data presented by City staff and a City consultant, ARC Alternatives, demonstrating that the anticipated savings in energy consumption realized by a proposed solar/energy efficiency improvement project will exceed the cost of the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, the California Energy Commission ("CEC") provides loans to local governments to finance energy efficiency improvements, and the City desires to pursue a CEC energy efficiency loan for the proposed project, and ARC Alternatives is qualified and capable of preparing and submitting a CEC loan application on behalf of the City; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the proposed project is Categorically Exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") per CEQA Guidelines section 15301 (Class 1 – Existing Facilities).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Fowler as follows:

- 1. The City of Fowler is authorized to apply for an energy efficiency loan from the California Energy Commission to implement solar/energy efficiency measures.
- 2. The City Council finds that the proposed solar/energy efficiency improvement project is categorically exempt under CEQA Guidelines section 15301 (Class 1 Existing Facilities).
- 3. ARC Alternatives is authorized to apply for a CEC energy efficiency loan on behalf of the City of Fowler to finance and implement the proposed project, and if the City is recommended for funding by the California Energy Commission, the City Manager is authorized to accept a loan of up to \$______ on behalf of the City of Fowler without further action of the City Council.
- 4. The amount of the loan will be paid in full, plus interest, under the terms and conditions of any applicable Loan Agreement, Promissory Note and Tax Certificate of the California Energy Commission.
- 5. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the City of Fowler all necessary documents to implement and carry out the purpose of this resolution, and to undertake all actions necessary to undertake and complete the energy efficiency project.
