EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The proposed Ordinance modifies the individuals authorized to issue payments from the City's banking accounts and codifies various policies that shall be adopted by Council Resolution.

BACKGROUND

This Ordinance was introduced at the October 3, 2023 City Council Meeting and approved by a 5-0 vote. Accordingly, it is being placed on the consent calendar.

This Ordinance clarifies the definition of payments from the City's banking accounts, removes the City Clerk as an authorized signer, and adds the Assistant City Manager as an authorized signer.

This Ordinance also codifies the requirement to adopt by Resolution a Purchasing Policy, Fixed Asset Policy, Policy on the Acceptance of Gifts to the City, and Credit Card Usage Policy.

The status of these policies is as follows:

Purchasing Policy

Currently adopted. Revisions are underway for consideration at a future City Council meeting.

Fixed Asset Policy

Currently adopted. Revisions are underway for consideration at a future City Council meeting.

Policy on the Acceptance of Gifts to the City

Currently adopted. Revisions will be presented at the October 17, 2023 City Council meeting.

Credit Card Usage Policy

Currently adopted.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER AMENDING SECTION 2-1.302 OF ARTICLE 3, OF CHAPTER 1, OF TITLE 2 REGARDING AUTHORIZATIONS TO SIGN WARRANTS; AND ADDING CHAPTER 10 TO TITLE 3 OF THE FOWLER MUNICIPAL CODE REQUIRING THE ADOPTION OF VARIOUS CITY POLICIES BY RESOLUTION RELATING TO FISCAL ADMINISTRATION

WHEREAS, strong internal controls and policies are an important practice in strong governance and accountability to residents; and

WHEREAS, these internal controls and policies shall be set by Council and reviewed from time to time for consistency and clarity; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to amend the Fowler Municipal Code for purpose of clarity, consistency, and understanding relating to the authorization to sign warrants on behalf of the City and the City's ability to adopt policies relating to fiscal administration.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOWLER DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Section 2-1.302 of Article 3, of Chapter 1, of Title 2 of the Fowler Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 2-1.302 Authority to sign warrants.
- (a) For the purposes of this Article, the term "warrant" shall mean an order to the depository of City funds to pay a particular sum of money, including by check or electronic funds transfer.
- (b) The following City officials shall have the authority to sign warrants drawn from on the City funds: Mayor, City Manager, Assistant City Manager, City Clerk, and Finance Director. All warrants shall require signatures by two (2) of these officials.

SECTION 2: Chapter 10 is hereby added to Title 3 the Fowler Municipal Code to read as follows:

Chapter 10 – Fiscal Administration.

3-10.101 – Purchasing Policy.

The City Council shall adopt, by Resolution, a Purchasing Policy for those transactions that do not constitute public works projects subject to the California Public Contract Code.

3-10.201 – Fixed Asset Policy.

The City Council shall adopt, by Resolution, a Fixed Asset Policy to address acquisition, accounting, internal controls, and disposition of certain City property.

3-10.301 – Policy on the Acceptance of Gifts to the City.

The City Council shall adopt, by Resolution, a Policy on the Acceptance of Gifts to the City.

3-10.401 – Credit Card Usage Policy.

The City Council shall adopt, by Resolution, a Credit Card Usage Policy.

SECTION 3. The City Council has determined that the Ordinance does not constitute a "project" for the purposes of environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk is further directed to cause this ordinance or a summary of this ordinance to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated within the City of Fowler, within fifteen (15) days after its adoption. If a summary of the ordinance is published, then the City Clerk shall cause a certified copy of the full text of the proposed ordinance to be posted in the office of the City Clerk at least five (5) days prior to the City Council meeting at which the ordinance is adopted and again after the meeting at which the ordinance is adopted. The summary shall be approved by the City Attorney.

- 2) The new Policy on Acceptance of Donations to the City attached to this Resolution is hereby adopted and approved to replace and supersede the Policy approved in 2002.

City of Fowler Policy on Acceptance of Donations to the City

On occasion, merchandise, equipment, and monies are donated to the City for programs, events, or other public benefits. This policy governs that process.

1. Acceptance Authority.

- a. <u>Under \$50,000</u>. Except for offers to donate real property to the City, donations under \$50,000 may be accepted or declined by the City Manager. The City Manager shall provide a biannual report to the City Council on all accepted donations received.
- b. \$50,000 and over. Donations of \$50,000 and over shall require City Council approval for acceptance. All donation offers of \$50,000 or more shall be presented to the City Council for consideration and acceptance at the next available City Council meeting after the offer has been made.
- c. <u>Decline to Accept</u>. Should the City Manager choose to decline to accept a donation offer, before informing the donor the City Manager shall notify the City Council in writing (email is sufficient) within five (5) business days of choosing to decline the donation offer or within such other reasonable time before the donation offer will expire. Any Councilmember may request the donation to be considered as an item on the agenda at an upcoming City Council meeting agenda by either of the following methods: a request may be made by a Councilmember during Council comments at any City Council meeting, or by individual communication to the City Manager that the item is requested to be considered at a City Council meeting, and the City Manager shall include the item on the next available City Council meeting agenda.
- d. <u>Referral</u>. The City Manager may refer any donation offer to the City Council for consideration at an upcoming City Council meeting.

2. Acceptance Process.

The City Manager or designee shall develop a donation acceptance form. This shall also serve as a receipt of acceptance to the donor.

3. Restricted Donations.

If a donor places any restrictions on the City's use of a donation, the City Manager shall determine, as a part of the acceptance process, if any restriction is reasonable and beneficial to the City. If the City Manager accepts the donation with the restriction(s), any restriction(s) shall be documented on the donation acceptance form and the City Manager shall implement means to ensure the restriction(s) and donor's wishes are honored.

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4. <u>Donation of Merchandise or Equipment</u>.

When merchandise or equipment is proposed to be donated to the City, the relevant Department Head shall provide the following, in writing, to the City Manager:

- a. Source(s) of donation.
- b. Actual or estimated dollar value of donation as provided by the donor.
- c. Description of item(s) including model number(s) and serial number(s), if applicable.
- d. Location of the item(s).
- e. Any costs to the City to transport, receive, or maintain the item(s).

5. <u>Donation of Cash, Cash Equivalents, or Securities</u>.

- a. <u>Cash.</u> All cash donations shall be entered and recorded into the City's accounting system on the same business day the donation is accepted by the City Manager, or the next business day after approval by the City Council. Funds shall be deposited into the City's bank account consistent with current practice or policy.
- b. <u>Cash Equivalents or Securities</u>. The City Manager shall determine whether donations of cash equivalents or securities should be immediately liquidated or retained in their original form. The City Manager is authorized to execute any necessary financial instruments to maintain or liquidate these donations. These donations, when maintained in their original form, are not subject to the Investment Policy.
- c. <u>Use of Funds.</u> The City Manager shall bring forward a budget amendment for City Council consideration and approval to allocate donated funds to any fund, project, and department, as appropriate and subject to any applicable restrictions.

6. Real Property.

All donations of real property, no matter the estimated or appraised value of the property, are subject to City Council approval of acceptance.

7. Right to Decline Approval or Acceptance of Donations.

Nothing in this policy shall require the City Manager or City Council to accept or decline any offered donation.

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8. Solicitation of Donations for Public Purpose.

Upon written approval by the City Manager, City employees may solicit donations to the City for a public purpose consistent with this policy. Such solicitations shall be subject to the direction and control of the City Manager and in accordance with any applicable laws.

SUBJECT: DISCUSSION of SB 1439 and the new disclosure/disqualification requirements

relating to receipt of campaign contributions in excess of \$250.00.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Senate Bill (SB) 1439 was enacted effective January 1, 2023, and amended Gov. Code Section 84308 of the Political Reform Act by requiring local government elected and appointed officials (such as city council members) to disclose and recuse themselves from participating in any proceedings involving a license, permit or other entitlement for use if the official received a campaign contribution in excess of \$250.00 from the party seeking the approval within twelve (12) months preceding the decision. Officials are also prohibited from accepting campaign contributions in excess of \$250.00 from the party seeking approval while the proceeding is pending and for twelve (12) months following the agency's decision.

BACKGROUND

What is now required.

Effective January 1, 2023, Government Code section 84308 of the Political Reform Act (the "Section") provides the following requirements and prohibitions:

- Council Members are prohibited from participating in a proceeding involving a license, permit, entitlement for use (as defined), if a campaign contribution in excess of \$250.00 was received from the party (or participant) seeking the approval within twelve (12) months before the decision. Any Council Member who received such a contribution from a party to the proceeding within the previous twelve (12) months must disclose the contribution and recuse themself from participating in the decision. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (b).)
- "License, permit, or other entitlement for use" is defined to mean all business, professional, trade, and land use licenses and permits and all other entitlements for use, including all entitlements for land use, all contracts (other than competitively bid, labor, or personal employment contracts), and all franchises. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (a)(5).)
- "Party" means any person who filed an application for, or is the subject of, a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (a)(1).) A "Participant" means a person that is not a party, but who actively

supports/opposes a particular decision in a proceeding. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (a)(2).)

- Council Members are also prohibited from accepting, soliciting, or directing a campaign contribution in excess of \$250.00 from a party (or participant) while a proceeding for a license, permit, or entitlement for use is pending, and for twelve (12) months after the date of the decision.
- The party to the proceeding seeking the approval must also disclose on the record any campaign contributions made to any Council members in excess of \$250.00 within the prior twelve (12) months by the party or their agent, and is further prohibited from making contributions in excess of \$250.00 to any member(s) of the City Council while the proceeding is pending and for twelve (12) months following the date of the Council's decision in the proceeding. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (e)(1) & (2).)
- There is both a "Look Back" and "Look Forward" period of twelve (12) months to identify
 any campaign contributions made to a Council Member in excess of \$250.00 from a party
 with a financial interest in the proceeding.
- Due to the effective date of the new law and "Look Back" requirements, the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) issued an opinion that the "Look Back" period only goes as far back as the effective date of the amendment, January 1, 2023. (FPPC Opinion No. O-22-002 [12/22/22].)

Ability for Council Members to Cure.

Prior to rendering any decision in a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement, including a franchise and most contracts, Council Members and parties to the proceeding each have duty to disclose on the record any contribution received or made in excess of \$250.00 in the past twelve (12) months (since 1/1/23). (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (c) & (e)(1).) The Section provides the following methods to cure a violation:

- Pre-decision cure.
 - If the Council Member accepts a contribution in excess of \$250.00 prior to the decision which would require disqualification, the Council Member may return the contribution within thirty (30) days of knowing about the contribution and the proceeding. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (d)(1).)
- Post-decision cure.
 - If a Council Member accepts a contribution in excess of \$250.00 during the twelve (12) months following the decision, the Council Member may return the contribution, or portion of the contribution in excess of \$250.00, within fourteen (14) days of accepting the contribution. (Gov. Code § 84308, subd. (e)(2).)

Consequences of violating SB 1439.

Council Members and parties to proceedings should note that that any violation of the Political Reform Act constitutes a misdemeanor violation and could result in fines up to \$10,000. (Gov. Code § 91000.) Any conviction under the Political Reform Act prohibits that person from serving as an elected official for four (4) years following the date of conviction. (Gov. Code § 91002.)

Furthermore, aside from potential criminal liability to the official, the City Council decision involving participation by an official who failed to disclose or disqualify themselves from the decision would be vulnerable to legal challenge, and attorney's fees may be awarded to the prevailing party. (Gov. Code § 91003, subd. (a).)

Recommendations for future items.

In an effort to prevent potential violations of this new requirement, some public agencies have included language on either their agendas or staff reports to remind city council members and others about the requirements and prohibitions of Section 84308. If Council is interested in a similar disclosure reminder on city council meeting agendas, the necessary disclosure text can be prepared.

Council members with specific questions about campaign contributions and disclosure requirements may consult their own campaign and legal advisor(s) and the FPPC.

PUBLIC NOTICE

This item does not require a public hearing and was noticed as a part of the City Council Agenda.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This item does not constitute a "project" pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

Senate Bill No. 1439

CHAPTER 848

An act to amend Section 84308 of the Government Code, relating to the Political Reform Act of 1974.

[Approved by Governor September 29, 2022. Filed with Secretary of State September 29, 2022.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1439, Glazer. Campaign contributions: agency officers.

The Political Reform Act of 1974 prohibits an officer of an agency from accepting, soliciting, or directing a contribution of more than \$250 from any party, participant, or a party or participant's agent, while a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use is pending before the agency and for 3 months following the date a final decision is rendered in the proceeding, if the officer knows or has reasons to know that the participant has a financial interest, as defined. The act also prohibits a party, participant, or participant's agent from making a contribution of more than \$250 to an officer of the agency during the proceeding and 3 months following the date a final decision is rendered. The act defines "agency" for these purposes to mean any state or local government agency, except certain entities, including local government agencies whose members are directly elected by the voters.

This bill would remove the exception for local government agencies, thereby subjecting them to the prohibition described above. The bill would extend the prohibition on contributions from 3 to 12 months following the date a final decision is rendered in the proceeding. The bill would permit an officer who does not willfully and knowingly accept, solicit, or direct a prohibited contribution to cure the violation by returning it. The bill would require the party to a proceeding to disclose whether the party or the party's agent has made a contribution of more than \$250 in the 12 months before the proceeding.

A violation of the act is punishable as a misdemeanor. By expanding the scope of restrictions on contributions, this bill would expand the scope of an existing crime, and therefore would impose a state-mandated local program.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

The Political Reform Act of 1974, an initiative measure, provides that the Legislature may amend the act to further the act's purposes upon a $\frac{2}{3}$

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vote of each house of the Legislature and compliance with specified procedural requirements.

This bill would declare that it furthers the purposes of the act.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 84308 of the Government Code is amended to read:

- 84308. (a) The definitions set forth in this subdivision shall govern the interpretation of this section.
- (1) "Party" means any person who files an application for, or is the subject of, a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use.
- (2) "Participant" means any person who is not a party but who actively supports or opposes a particular decision in a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use and who has a financial interest in the decision, as described in Article 1 (commencing with Section 87100) of Chapter 7. A person actively supports or opposes a particular decision in a proceeding if that person lobbies in person the officers or employees of the agency, testifies in person before the agency, or otherwise acts to influence officers of the agency.
- (3) "Agency" means an agency as defined in Section 82003 except that it does not include the courts or any agency in the judicial branch of government, the Legislature, the Board of Equalization, or constitutional officers. However, this section applies to any person who is a member of an exempted agency but is acting as a voting member of another agency.
- (4) "Officer" means any elected or appointed officer of an agency, any alternate to an elected or appointed officer of an agency, and any candidate for elective office in an agency.
- (5) "License, permit, or other entitlement for use" means all business, professional, trade, and land use licenses and permits and all other entitlements for use, including all entitlements for land use, all contracts (other than competitively bid, labor, or personal employment contracts), and all franchises.
- (6) "Contribution" includes contributions to candidates and committees in federal, state, or local elections.
- (b) While a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use is pending, and for 12 months following the date a final decision is rendered in the proceeding, an officer of an agency shall not accept, solicit, or direct a contribution of more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) from any party or a party's agent, or from any participant or a participant's agent if the officer knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest, as that term is used in Article 1 (commencing with Section 87100) of Chapter 7. This prohibition shall apply regardless of whether the officer accepts, solicits, or directs the contribution on the officer's own behalf, or on behalf of any other officer, or on behalf of any candidate for office or on behalf of any committee.

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- (c) Prior to rendering any decision in a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending before an agency, each officer of the agency who received a contribution within the preceding 12 months in an amount of more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) from a party or from any participant shall disclose that fact on the record of the proceeding. An officer of an agency shall not make, participate in making, or in any way attempt to use the officer's official position to influence the decision in a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending before the agency if the officer has willfully or knowingly received a contribution in an amount of more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) within the preceding 12 months from a party or a party's agent, or from any participant or a participant's agent if the officer knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest in the decision, as that term is described with respect to public officials in Article 1 (commencing with Section 87100) of Chapter 7.
- (d) (1) If an officer receives a contribution which would otherwise require disqualification under this section, and returns the contribution within 30 days from the time the officer knows, or should have known, about the contribution and the proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use, the officer shall be permitted to participate in the
- (2) (A) Subject to subparagraph (B), if an officer accepts, solicits, or directs a contribution of more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) during the 12 months after the date a final decision is rendered in the proceeding in violation of subdivision (b), the officer may cure the violation by returning the contribution, or the portion of the contribution in excess of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), within 14 days of accepting, soliciting, or directing the contribution, whichever comes latest.
- (B) An officer may cure a violation as specified in subparagraph (A) only if the officer did not knowingly and willfully accept, solicit, or direct the prohibited contribution.
- (C) An officer's controlled committee, or the officer if no controlled committee exists, shall maintain records of curing any violation pursuant to this paragraph.
- (e) (1) A party to a proceeding before an agency involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use shall disclose on the record of the proceeding any contribution in an amount of more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) made within the preceding 12 months by the party or the party's agent.
- (2) A party, or agent to a party, to a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending before any agency or a participant, or agent to a participant, in the proceeding shall not make a contribution of more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) to any officer of that agency during the proceeding and for 12 months following the date a final decision is rendered by the agency in the proceeding.
- (3) When a closed corporation is a party to, or a participant in, a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use pending

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before an agency, the majority shareholder is subject to the disclosure and prohibition requirements specified in this section.

- (f) This section shall not be construed to imply that any contribution subject to being reported under this title shall not be so reported.
- SEC. 2. No reimbursement is required by this act pursuant to Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution because the only costs that may be incurred by a local agency or school district will be incurred because this act creates a new crime or infraction, eliminates a crime or infraction, or changes the penalty for a crime or infraction, within the meaning of Section 17556 of the Government Code, or changes the definition of a crime within the meaning of Section 6 of Article XIII B of the California Constitution.
- SEC. 3. The Legislature finds and declares that this bill furthers the purposes of the Political Reform Act of 1974 within the meaning of subdivision (a) of Section 81012 of the Government Code.
